



Key AFF product export value to ASEAN, August 2024





Singapore and EU Conclude Digital Trade Agreement



The 21st China-ASEAN Expo (CAEXPO)

The 21st CAEXPO took place from September 24-28, 2024, in Nanning, China, covering an area of 200,000 m² with the participation of over 3,000 enterprises. The CAEXPO introduced numerous new activities, focusing on digital, green, and low-carbon technologies, new energy, and intelligent vehicles.

Over the past 20 years, bilateral trade between ASEAN and China has significantly increased, rising from USD 124.3 billion in 2004 to USD 909 billion in 2023, with an average annual growth rate of 11%/year. In the first eight months of 2024, China-ASEAN trade reached USD 638 billion, accounting for 15.7% of China's total trade value. ASEAN is the China's second-largest suppliers of agricultural products, particularly durian and tropical fruits.

China and ASEAN are advancing the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) and negotiating the ASEAN-China Free Trade Area version 3.0, opening new opportunities for regional development.

Singapore and EU Sign Digital Trade Agreement












Top 5 eport enterprises by volume to ASEAN, Aug-24

The Philippines' rice imports in the first eight months of 2024 was 2.8 million tons, up 19% compared to 2.3 million tons in the same period of 2023. In August 2024, Vietnam remains the Philippines' leading rice supplier, with imported volume of more than 2.17 million tons, accounting for about 77% of the Philippines' total imports; following by Thailand, Pakistan, and Myanmar.

Myanmar exported 718,281 tonnes of rice and broken rice in the first five months of the 2024-25 fiscal year, which began in April 2024. The Southeast Asian country earned \$353 million from exporting rice. Of which, 207,369 tonnes of rice and broken rice were exported in August, earning \$97 million. Myanmar exported rice and broken rice by sea and land to more than 30 countries, with Indonesia, China, the Philippines, the Netherlands, and Belgium being the top markets.

According to the Cambodia Rice Federation, Cambodia exported 412,023 tons of rice in the first eight months of 2024, earning \$305 million. Fifty-three companies shipped rice from Cambodia to 65 countries and regions during the January-August period of 2024. China continues to be one of the main markets of Cambodian rice. Cambodia exported 77,792 tons of rice to China, earning a total revenue of nearly \$48.9 million in the first eight months of 2024.








Changes in percentage of export value to the ASEAN, Aug-2024





Thailand plans to increase frozen durian exports

To address the intense competition from fresh durians from Vietnam, Thailand experts recommend to change to export frozen durians. It is estimated that the transportation cost of durian peels from Thailand to China reached USD 325-350 million in 2023. Exporting durian pulp to China could significantly reduce transportation costs, thereby increasing profit and value. This strategy also offers Thailand farmers a more stable income from durian sales, enabling them to focus on quality and flavour rather than size. Additionally, frozen durians align with the consumption habits of youngers, modern consumers, particularly small households.

16 batches of Thai durian are warned by China for being contaminated with heavy metal cadmium

According to the Thailand Deputy Minister, Ministry of Agriculture, as of March 11, 2024, the General Administration of Customs of China reported the detection of cadmium contamination in 16 shipments of durians originating from 12 packaging facilities and 15 orchards in Thailand.

These durian cultivation regions are in Chumphon, Chanthaburi, and Yala provinces. In response, the Thailand Ministry of Agriculture promptly suspended exports from the implicated packaging facilities and orchards and collected durian, soil, and water samples for further analysis. Preliminary testing results confirmed the presence of cadmium in some of the samples.

Malaysian durian farmers adapt flavors for the Chinese market

Some farmers in Malaysia are piloting the flavor changes of Musang King durians to serve to the Chinese market. According to Dr. Zulhazmi Sayuti from the Horticulture Research Center of the Malaysian Agricultural Research and Development Institute, modifying the durian flavor through genetic modification is feasible but highly challenging due to the complexity of identifying specific genes without affecting other characteristics of the fruit.

The Philippine Competition Commission (PCC) is preparing to sue a group of 12 onion importers and traders for engaging in practices that undermine competitive market conditions. The proposed fines against the violators total \$42.7 million (P2.4 billion).

Malaysian Durian Targets the Premium Market in China

Fresh Malaysian durians has being imported into the Chinese market via air transport after receiving approval. The first batch of fresh Malaysian durians was exported to China at a price of 28 USD/kg (200 CNY/kg), with Musang King durians priced as high as 36 USD/kg (258 CNY/kg). The export price of frozen durians was around 22.5 USD/kg (160 CNY/kg), much higher than durian prices of Viet Nam and Thailand.

SPOTLIGHT

According to Thailand's Bangkok Post, the average price of Thai durians exported to China is 5.8 USD/kg (41 CNY/kg), while Vietnamese durians are priced at approximately 4.22 USD/kg (30 CNY/kg). The price of Malaysian durians is significantly higher compared to other countries. However, Malaysia can take advantages of short using time of fresh durians as a competitive advantage, positioning Malaysian durians as a premium product in the Chinese market.









Structure of exports by products to the ASEAN, Aug-2024








Structure of export value by products to ASEAN, Aug-2024










Structure of export value by products to ASEAN, Aug-2024



Typhoon Yagi has a significant impact on cassava production in many ASEAN countries.

Since Typhoon Yagi made landfall, it significantly impacted cassava production in the Philippines, Thailand, Vietnam, and other ASEAN countries.

- **Philippines:** According to data from the Philippine Ministry of Agriculture, Typhoon Yagi caused damage to over 15,000 tons of rice, cassava, corn, and other crops, affecting an area of 9,245 hectares. Cassava production losses is about 89 tons, equivalent to approximately 31,500 USD.


- **Thailand:** Affected by Typhoon Yagi's circulation, Northern and Northeastern regions of Thailand experienced heavy rain and strong winds, leading to flooding and damage to cassava, rice, and other crops. Khon Kaen province supports for cassava farmers who damaged with support level of 1,980 baht per rai, with a maximum support of 30 rai per household, which will be paid by the end of this year.












TOP 5 export enterprises by value to the ASEAN, Aug-2024

Shrimp prices in Southeast Asian countries in Sep-24

In **Thailand**, the price of 60-count per kilogram of white shrimp reached its highest level since 2017, hitting 4.51 USD/kg in week 37 (September 9–15). The price of 80-count shrimp also rose to 3.91 USD/kg. The reason is the reduction of shrimp supply and rising demand from processing facilities preparing for the Christmas and New Year holidays.

In Vietnam, shrimp prices also rebounded after a short period of stability. In week 37, the price of 60-count per kilogram white shrimp reached 4.32 USD/kg, an increase of 0.25 USD compared to early September and a 28% increase compared to early August. Larger shrimp, such as 30-count and 40-count, has higher price at 6.28 USD/kg and 5.34 USD/kg, respectively. Despite the price increases, Vietnamese farmers' revenues remain 13% lower than the same period in 2022.

Conversely, in **Indonesia**, shrimp prices dropped sharply in week 38 (September 16–22). The price of 60-count shrimp fell to 4.08 USD/kg, while 70–90-count shrimp dropped from 3.52 USD/kg to 3.38 USD/kg. However, the price of 100-count shrimp in Indonesia rose to 3.38 USD/kg. In the East Java region, prices remained stable, with 40-count shrimp selling for 4.82 USD/kg.

Thailand encourages people to destroy invasive Tilapia

On September 3, 2024, Thailand caught over 1.3 million kilograms of black tilapia (Sarotherodon melanotheron), an invasive species causing harm to ecosystems in rivers, swamps, and canals across 19 provinces. This species poses a threat to Thailand's aquaculture, causing an economic damage of 10 billion baht (293 million USD).

In July this year, Thailand declared to kill black tilapia as a national priority and offering 15 baht (0.42 USD) per kilogram for catching. Authorities are also releasing predators to hunt the Tilapia and developing genetically modified blackchin tilapia to produce sterile offspring. Several provinces are promoting products such as fish sauce and sausages made from Tilapia, while restaurants are increasingly using black tilapia into their dishes.









Percentage of export value to the ASEAN, Aug-2024









MEAT & MEAT PRODUCTS



The domestic pork production of Philippines is about 1.06 million metric tons (CWE) in 2024, an increase of nearly 2% compared to the previous year. However, this level remains lower than pre-African swine fever (ASF) outbreak levels and will be in low level until 2025. The ASF outbreak continues to affect Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao, limiting herd replenishment and production during the second half of 2024 and early 2025.

SPOTLIGHT

Pork consumption in Philippines is forecasted to grow by 2% in 2025, reaching 1.58 million metric tons (CWE), driving by economic growth and population increase.

Pork imports will increase by more than 6%, reaching 510,000 metric tons (CWE) in 2025, because of disease-related supply shortages and increasing demand. Additionally, Executive Order No. 3, which allows Brazil to expand pork exports to the Philippines, contributes to this increase in imports.
