





Export proportion of AFF product to the ASEAN, May-2025


Changes in export proportion of AFF product to the ASEAN May-2025 compared to Apr-25 and May-24





Key AFF product export value to ASEAN. May2025




Changes in key AFF product export value to ASEAN in May 2025 compared to Apr 2025

Vietnam and Cambodia promote trade cooperation



Argentina-ASEAN: Strategic Partnership in a Changing World



Vietnam and Cambodia promote trade cooperation

Vietnam and Cambodia are actively promoting bilateral trade cooperation through the Trade Partnership Cooperation Workshop held on June 20, 2025, in Phnom Penh. The event was organized by the Cambodian Ministry of Commerce and the Vietnam Trade Office in Cambodia, with the participation of more than 60 representatives from enterprises, associations, and regulatory agencies of both countries.

In the first four months of 2025, bilateral trade turnover reached over USD 3 billion, marking a 7% increase compared to the same period in 2024. Vietnam is in the top five largest investors in Cambodia, with more than 200 projects and a total registered capital of nearly USD 3 billion. The two countries have signed a bilateral trade agreement for the 2025–2026 period, aiming to reach a bilateral trade volume of USD 20 billion in the near future.

The forum also facilitates business networking, product promotion, and expansion of cooperation, with a particular emphasis on the critical role of infrastructure investment, cross-border trade, and technological innovation in fostering sustainable development and enhancing regional welfare.

Argentina-ASEAN: Strategic Partnership in a Changing World

On June 12, 2025, the scientific seminar on "Argentina–ASEAN: Strategic Partners in a Changing World" was held in Buenos Aires, co-organized by the Argentine National Congress and the ASEAN Committee in Buenos Aires (ACBA). The event underscored ASEAN's growing significance, particularly in agricultural, food, and trade cooperation.

In 2023, bilateral trade volume between Argentina and ASEAN exceeded USD 9 billion, with Vietnam emerging as Argentina's largest trading partner within ASEAN, reaching USD 3.45 billion. Scholars at the seminar commended Vietnam's development trajectory in industrialization, digital transformation, and international integration.

The discussions also highlighted the substantial cooperation potential in Halal industries, technology, education, and cultural exchange, pointing to promising avenues for deeper bilateral and multilateral engagement.












Top 5 export enterprises by value to ASEAN, May-2025




Top 5 export enterprises by volume to ASEAN, May-2025

In the first two months of the 2025/2026 fiscal year (beginning April 1, 2025), Myanmar exported over 402,283 metric tons of rice and broken rice, including approximately 217,070 tons of rice and 185,213 tons of broken rice. Of this volume, more than 402,000 tons were shipped via maritime routes, while 280 tons were exported overland to neighboring countries. In 2024/2025 fiscal year (April 1, 2024 – March 31, 2025), Myanmar exported a total of 2.48 million tons of rice and broken rice, generating revenue of over USD 1.129 billion. For the current season, MRF has set a target of 2.5 million tons in rice exports.

The Ministry of Commerce is coordinating with the Union of Myanmar Federation of Chambers of Commerce and Industry (UMFCCI), the Myanmar Rice Federation, and other industry associations to ensure monthly export progress and to facilitate rice trade operations.

In the first five months of 2025, rice imports of Philippines declined significantly to 1.7 million metric tons, a 20.9% decrease compared to the same period last year. The primary reason for this drop was an increase in domestic rice production, which reached 4.69 million metric tons in Q1 2025. USDA forecasts that Philippines will be the world's largest rice importer in 2025, with projected imports of 5.4 million metric tons, rising to 5.5 million metric tons in 2026 due to growing demand driven by population growth and tourism.



The Philippine government has reduced the rice import tariff to 15% until 2028, with quarterly reviews to monitor its impact. Agriculture Secretary Francisco Tiu Laurel Jr. stated that the government may consider gradually increasing import tariffs during the upcoming harvest season to support local farmers and maintain supply-demand balance..
















Changes in percentage of import value to the ASEAN, May-2025

Thai AirAsia buys 1,000 tons of fruit for in-flight menu to support farmers

Thai AirAsia announced its decision to procure 1,000 metric tons of fruits—including longan, mangosteen, and pineapple—directly from local farmers to incorporate into its in-flight menu on all domestic and international routes starting July 2025. The objective of this initiative is to support growers by creating added value and reducing post-harvest losses. This effort is part of the airline's "Fruits On Board" strategy, which aims to expand agricultural distribution channels, increase farmers' income, and enhance the culinary experience for passengers on board.

Thailand holds fruit festival to boost domestic consumption

Thailand will organize "Thailand Fruit Festival 2025" to boost domestic consumption and stabilize fruit prices, particularly for durian. The festival will take place across 13 markets in Bangkok and its outskirts, featuring a range of promotional programs, such as durian priced at 99 THB per fruit (approximately USD 2.75) and tiered pricing from 99 to 199 THB per kilogram (around USD 2.75–5.53/kg), allowing consumers to choose based on their preferences.

Each day, more than 50 metric tons of fruit are expected to be distributed. A special highlight event will be held at Siam Square from June 19 to 22, showcasing premium fruits from Thailand's renowned growing regions.

Philippines doubles coconut replanting target by 2026

Philippines is promoting its coconut replanting program to regain its position as the world's top coconut producer which lost to Indonesia nearly three decades ago. While the country remains the global leader in coconut exports, it currently ranks second in production volume.

Philippines has now set a target to plant 50 million coconut trees by 2026, effectively doubling its original goal. This accelerated plan is part of a five-year initiative launched in 2023, aiming to plant 100 million coconut trees by 2028. In 2024, more than 8.5 million trees were planted, with an additional 15 million trees expected by the end of the year.

Indonesia discusses to expand tropical fruit market in New Zealand

Following the successful export of pineapples to New Zealand, Indonesia is seeking to expand its exports of other tropical fruits, including bananas, mangoes, and papayas. During a bilateral meeting on the sidelines of the OECD Ministerial Council Meeting on June 4, 2025, Indonesia proposed strengthening cooperation in technical standards, food safety, and the adoption of electronic certification systems.

The initiative aims to raise bilateral trade volume to NZD 6 billion (approximately USD 3.7 billion) by 2029. This move enables Indonesia to capitalize on New Zealand's open market policies and respond to the growing demand for tropical fruits in the country.






Export volume and value to Manager May 2023





On May 16, 2025, the ASEAN Coffee Federation (ACF) officially launched the ASEAN Coffee Appreciation Protocol (ACAP)—a regional coffee quality assessment system developed by experts of Southeast Asia. The system was developed by the ASEAN Coffee Institute (ACI) to support training and valuation needs based on regional standards.

ACAP is an alternative to the Coffee Value Assessment (CVA) framework currently being promoted globally by the Specialty Coffee Association (SCA) in the United States and the United Kingdom, especially in Indonesia.

The ACAP framework consists of six core evaluation modules: (1) Technical Assessment – covering cultivation, processing, transportation, and storage; (2) Descriptive Sensory Evaluation – analyzing the flavor profile of green coffee beans; (3) Roasting Evaluation – assessing quality post-roasting; (4) Brewing Evaluation – examining effectiveness and methods of coffee preparation; (5) Consumer Perception Evaluation – capturing feedback on quality from end-users; (6) Skill Assessment – designed for barista training and certification.








- Indonesia's coffee production for the 2025/26 crop year is projected to reach 11.3 million 60-kg bags, representing a 5% increase year-on-year, driven by favorable weather conditions and greater use of agricultural inputs, particularly in Robusta-growing provinces such as South Sumatra. Robusta accounts for approximately 87% of the country's total coffee output.
- Exports are expected to rise by 7% to 6.5 million bags, with major destinations including the European Union (1.4 million bags) and the United States (726,000 bags between March 2024 and February 2025, a 23% increase). However, shipments to the U.S. may decline if the proposed 32% tariff by President Donald Trump takes effect in July 2025. Additionally, the EU Deforestation Regulation (EUDR), will be enforced by the end of 2025 and impose compliance pressures on exporters.
- **Domestic consumption** is expected to rise slightly to 4.81 million bags, as consumers increasingly turn to low-cost products and ready-to-drink (RTD) coffee options.




Change in percentage of export to ASEAN, May-2025









Thai Union introduces SeaChange 2030 initiative


At the United Nations Ocean Conference from June 9–13, 2025, in Nice, France, Thai Union introduces its SeaChange 2030 sustainable development strategy, featuring 11 commitments aimed at protecting the oceans, in alignment with UN Sustainable Development Goal 14. The company plans to invest USD 200 million in these initiatives by 2030.

According to 2024 Sustainability Report, 98.9% of the company's tuna volume was sourced from fisheries either certified by the Marine Stewardship Council (MSC) or engaged in Fishery Improvement Projects (FIPs)—a 14% increase over the previous year. On-the-ground monitoring coverage in the tuna supply chain reached 97%, with a target of 100% by 2025.

Thai Union also reported a 21% reduction in Scope 1 and 2 greenhouse gas emissions, certified 23 out of 32 facilities as zero-landfill, launched the Lower Carbon Shrimp program to reduce emissions in shrimp production, and removed 234 metric tons of plastic from the marine environment.








Changes in percentage of export value to ASEAN, May-2025





Malaysia's wood exports have opportunity to improve competitive advantages in the U.S. market because the US imposed higher tariffs on key competitors such as Vietnam (up to 46%) and Indonesia, while Malaysia faces a lower rate of 24%. The U.S. is currently the Malaysia's largest export destination, accounting for more than half of the total export value of Malaysian furniture. However, the tariffs announced in April have been temporarily suspended for 90 days and may be subject to adjustments through tariff negotiations.

According to Mr. Wan Tarmeze, Director of the Forest Products Division at FRIM, Malaysia's furniture industry remains heavily reliant on processed wood, which makes up 85% of raw material inputs. He emphasized that transitioning from Original Equipment Manufacturing (OEM) to Own Brand Manufacturing (OBM) is critical to increasing export value. However, despite repeated encouragement from the government, progress in this transformation has remained limited


Indonesia's Ministry of Trade (Kemendag) is supporting domestic exporters in response to the anti-dumping and countervailing duty investigations initiated by the U.S. Department of Commerce concerning hardwood plywood and decorative plywood exports.

Kemendag is assisting affected companies in preparing defense documentation and completing the investigation questionnaires. Currently, approximately one-third of Indonesia's total production of hardwood and decorative plywood is exported to the United States, making this a critical issue for the sector.






Changes in percentage of export value to ASEAN, May-2025










TOP 5 export enterprises by value to ASEAN, May-2025

❖ Thailand: Aiming to become a hub for rubber production, trade and innovation

On the occasion of the 10th anniversary, the Rubber Authority of Thailand (GYTA) announced a new strategy for comprehensive rubber system management, aiming to become a global hub for rubber production, trade, and innovation.

As part of this strategy, GYTA is promoting the development of high value-added rubber products, such as the "Greenergy Tyre", enhancing efforts to combat rubber smuggling, and establishing a national rubber reference price to reclaim pricing power. The agency is also supporting farmers, businesses, and research institutes throughout the value chain and promoting traceability standards aligned with EU regulations.

Thailand is currently the only Southeast Asian country with a fully implemented system for sustainable rubber quality and origin control, giving it a significant competitive edge in the global market. GYTA is confident that its comprehensive innovation strategy will help Thailand maintain its position as a leading global rubber producer.







Laos expands rubber plantations to support local people livelihoods

The provincial government of Bokeo, northern Laos, approved a 30-year cooperation agreement with a rubber processing factory to develop rubber plantations covering 5,000 hectares in Paktha District. The factory will provide seedlings, technical training, and collaborate with local farmers in land development, thereby contributing to green space expansion and rural livelihood improvement.

This rubber planting initiative in Laos aims to promote sustainable socio-economic development, environmental protection, and poverty alleviation. It is part of a broader strategy to expand industrial forest areas, increase green coverage, and support agriculture as a long-term livelihood for rural communities.

❖ Malaysia's natural rubber output to fall sharply in April 2025


According to the Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM), in April 2025, natural rubber production recorded a significant decline of 37.3%, with export volume of 18,008 tons compared to the previous month.

Similarly, natural rubber exports was 35,901 tons in April, falling by 31.7%. China remained the largest export destination, accounting for 33.3% of Malaysia's total natural rubber exports, followed by the United Arab Emirates (14.9%), Germany (14.2%), India (6.5%), and the United States (5.1%).

The sharp decline in both production and exports indicates that Malaysia's rubber industry is facing many challenges in terms of output and trade. Market analysts emphasize that demand recovery in major export markets and price stabilization will be key factors to monitor in the coming months.





Percentage of export value to ASEAN, May-2025




Changes in percentage of export value to ASEAN, May-2025





Changes in percentage of export value to ASEAN, May-2025









Changes in percentage of import value to ASEAN, May-2025





On June 2, 2025, Mayor Alfredo Abelardo Benitez issued Executive Order No. 11-2025, officially declaring that Bacolod City is free from African Swine Fever (ASF). The city was reclassified by the Department of Agriculture – Western Visayas from a "red zone" (infected area) to a "pink zone" (buffer area) after meeting the national recovery standards outlined in the ASF guidelines. As of May 16, Bacolod is among 498 localities nationwide upgraded under the National ASF Prevention and Control Program.

Previously, in mid-2023, Bacolod reported its first four ASF cases, which devastated backyard swine herds, with 842 households reporting pig deaths. In response, Mayor Benitez lifted the ban on the entry of live pigs and pork products in May 2024 to meet local consumption needs and support the revitalization of the local swine sector.
