







AFF product import - export turnover between Vietnam and ASEAN. Apr-2023




Key AFF product export value to ASEAN. Apr-2023

Asean to start negotiations on digital economy pact in Q3

The Indonesian Minister of Coordination for Economic Affairs, Airlangga Hartarto, recently announced that ASEAN member countries have agreed to expedite the commencement of negotiations for the ASEAN Digital Economy Framework Agreement (DEFA) in the third quarter of 2023.

The economic growth of ASEAN is estimated to reach 4.7% in 2023 and is forecasted to further increase to 5% in 2024. Meanwhile, the region's digital economy is predicted to reach \$330 billion in terms of total merchandise value by 2025, up from \$194 billion in the previous year.

DEFA is expected to establish a safe and healthy environment for developing the digital economy while addressing consumer protection and data privacy concerns. It is anticipated to be the foundation for building a robust and comprehensive digital economy in ASEAN, facilitating trade development among ASEAN countries..






Changes in percentage of export value to the ASEAN, Apr-2023










TOP 5 export enterprises by value, Apr-2023




TOP 5 export enterprises by volume, Apr-2023

Thailand's rice exports in the first three months of 2023 reached 38.06 billion THB (over 1 billion USD), an increase of 29.26% compared to the same period in 2022. Among them, Iraq is the largest market for Thai rice, accounting for 16.38% of Thailand's total rice exports, followed by Indonesia (13.08%), the United States (8.62%), South Africa (8.24%), and Senegal (5.86%).










Export volume and value to the ASEAN, Apr-2023










Structure of exports by products to the ASEAN





Indonesia's coffee production drops sharply in 2023

In Indonesia, the world's third-largest producer of Robusta coffee, prolonged heavy rainfall has raised concerns about decreased coffee yield. The Association of Indonesian Coffee Exporters and Industries has stated that Indonesia's coffee production in 2023 is expected to reduce by 20% compared to the previous year, reaching only 9.6 million bags due to damages caused by excessive rain in coffee-growing regions.

Indonesian coffee exports in the crop year 2023/24 decreased by about 32%

According to the USDA, it is forecasted that Indonesia's green coffee exports will decrease by approximately 32% in the 2023/24 crop year compared to the previous year, reaching around 5.2 million bags. The significant decline in the country's coffee production has a substantial impact on the supply of exports.

The coffee acreage in Indonesia remains stable at 1.2 million hectares and is expected to increase by about 3,000 hectares in 2023. Approximately 60-70% of the total coffee cultivation area is located in Sumatra.














Export volume and value to the ASEAN, Apr-2023










Structure of exports by products to the ASEAN, Apr-2023












Value ratio of TOP 5 export enterprises to the ASEAN, Apr-2023

Thailand's natural rubber exports in the first four months of 2023 reached 910,000 tons, a 23% decrease compared to last year. Thailand exported 379,000 tons of natural rubber to China, an increase of 1.3% compared to the same period the previous year.

The Malaysian government provides a financial assistance program called Aidilfitri Special Financial Aid (BKKA) with the total support of 13.98 million USD to 318,642 smallholder rubber-producing households through the Smallholder Rubber Industry Development Authority. According to the Minister of Agriculture of Malaysia, each smallholder household will receive a support payment of 43.69 USD.


According to the Rubber General Department of Cambodia report, in Q1/2023, the country exported 65.92 thousand metric tons of dry rubber, valued at 90 million USD. This represents a 6.8% increase in volume and a 9.5% increase in value compared to the same period in 2022. The average rubber export price was recorded at 1,351 USD per metric ton, a 15% decrease compared to the same period in 2022. The main export markets for Cambodian rubber are Malaysia, Vietnam, Singapore, and China.

The Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperatives of Thailand forecasts that the country's rubber production will reach 4.951 million tons, an increase of 2.59% in 2023. The projected growth in production is attributed to Thai farmers expanding the cultivation area since 2017, along with the expectation of abundant rainfall, good quality rubber trees, and an extended tapping period.






Changes in percentage of export value to the ASEAN, Apr-2023






Structure of exports by products to the ASEAN, Apr-2023




TOP 5 export enterprises by value , Apr-2023




TOP 5 export enterprises by volume , Apr-2023

SPOTLIGHTS

From the beginning of the year until now, Cambodia has been the largest market for supplying cashew nuts to Vietnam. Vietnam has spent nearly 676 million USD to import cashew nuts from Cambodia, accounting for almost 63.8% of the total import value of this commodity in the first four months of this year.

According to Vinacas (Vietnam Cashew Association), the strategic direction of cashew-producing countries in Africa and Cambodia is to develop the domestic processing industry and gradually reduce raw exports. Therefore, they have implemented various preferential policies to attract investment in cashew processing factories. They regulate and closely monitor minimum export prices and impose high export tax rates for raw cashew nut exports. Conversely, they provide tax exemptions for processed cashew nuts for export.








Structure of exports by products to the ASEAN, Apr-2023






TOP 5 export enterprises by value, Apr-2023




TOP 5 export enterprises by volume, Feb-2023





Indonesia is negotiating to increase the fishing quota of bluefin tuna

The Indonesian Ministry of Fisheries and Maritime Affairs is pursuing negotiations to secure additional catch quotas for bluefin tuna to curb illegal fishing. From 2018 to 2020, Indonesia had an annual allowed catch quota of 1,023 tons for bluefin tuna. After intense negotiations, the percentage was subsequently increased to 1,123 tons from 2021 to 2023.







TOP 5 export enterprises by value, Apr-2023


TOP 5 import enterprises by value, Apr-2023

On May 2, Indonesia confirmed that one of its farms supplied pigs infected with African Swine Fever (ASF) for an export order to Singapore. Specifically, samples taken from the farm in Pulau Bulan, Riau province, which accounted for approximately 15% of Singapore's total pork supply, were tested and confirmed positive for ASF.

Live chickens from Indonesia have been certified as free from the avian influenza virus, allowing them to be transported directly to Singapore. This marks the first time Indonesia has exported live chickens to Singapore. The opening of the live chicken market in Singapore is expected to create a balance between supply and demand and improve the welfare of Indonesian farmers.

COMMENTS AND REVIEW

RICE

The increasing demand for rice imports in traditional markets such as the Philippines and Indonesia creates opportunities for the Vietnamese rice industry to accelerate its exports. Indonesia has decided to increase its rice procurement for stockpiling to 2.4 million tons, double the previous quantity of around 1.2 million tons, to ensure food security.



SEAFOOD

In the second quarter of 2023, the value of seafood exports to the ASEAN market is expected to decrease by approximately 4% compared to the same period in 2022. This decline is primarily due continued decrease in consumer demand resulting from inflationary pressures. Additionally, record-high and volatile prices of input materials used in seafood production have led to high production costs, making it challenging for seafood products to compete with those from countries like India and Ecuador.



PEPPER

The Ministry of Industry and Trade forecasts that pepper exports to ASEAN markets will experience optimistic growth in the second quarter of 2023 due to high demand from these markets. The export activities of pepper will be more vibrant as domestic pepper production is currently high, just after the harvest season, and not competing with major producers like Brazil and Indonesia, as these countries harvest in the later months of the year.

COFFEE

The export price of coffee is expected to continue rising in the last month of the second quarter of 2023 due to scarce supply. Additionally, the lower cost compared to Arabica coffee provides a competitive advantage for Robusta coffee, especially in the context of increasing concerns about ongoing economic recession.
